most certainly our ultimate resurrection rests here.

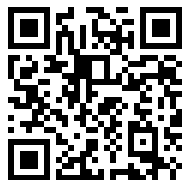
The silver thread of resurrection runs through all the blessings, from regeneration onward to our eternal glory, and binds them together.
