DISHEARTENING/LOVING EVANGELISM from CHRIST-Mark 10:17-22

"And Jesus, looking at him, loved him...Disheartened by the saying, he went away sorrowful."

Mark 10:21a, 22a

The kind of Christianity that will not allow the attachment of eternal life onto an essentially worldly life is not an easy sell in any generation. It is disheartening news to any clinging to a superficial view of the righteousness of God. Nevertheless the clear proclamation that all gods must be dethroned to make way for the crowning of Jesus Christ as LORD is completely consistent with love for souls. It is not love to leave gospel hearers under the impression that they are safe to cherish both earthly and heavenly treasure. One must experience the sorrow of relinquishing one or the other. In all true con-

versions the grace of God enables the repentant sinner to see that worshiping the creature more than the Creator is a deadly contagion that has infected the soul. The joyful realization that Christ is the true cure is a sufficient counterbalance to overcome any sorrow from worldly loss. Perhaps the dethroning of no false god is so likely to be disheartening as that of money. For that reason, the grace of God in the churches of Macedonia ought to fuel our faith. Paul said, "...for in a severe test of affliction, their abundance OF JOY AND THEIR EXTREME POV-ERTY have overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part." II Corinthians 8:2.
