It may be hard to believe, but there was a time when mass media did not spend time seeking out the opinions of "the man on the street." At some point news people must have discovered that printing or airing such opinions sold their product. It was flattering to those questioned to see their words in print or to tell their friends they were going to be on television.

I am sure nobody foresaw how opportunities for the common man to "speak his mind" would explode. Nobody has to wait for someone to stick a mike in their face now. Everybody can publish their thoughts whenever they have the urge. It is entirely under our control. Therefore, as Christians, we must be

sure it is controlled in a Christ-honoring way. Hasty speech is often a fruit of unmortified pride. We are inclined to assume that the first thing that comes to our minds is worthy of being shared with others. At the very least we need to be sure they would pass the fact check. But our motives must be examined as well. Are we really aiming to spread truth for the glory of Christ, or simply to parade our wisdom? Are we speaking the truth in love, or just swinging the sword of truth without redemptive aims? Plus, we must practice the Christian art of being angry and sinning not. Unregulated emotions can easily run ahead of reason. Nehemiah was very angry at the way some wealthy Jews were treating their brethren. But he "thought seriously" before he issued his rebuke. A fool gives vent to his spirit, but a wise man quietly holds it back.
