Congress declared the 1st Monday in September Labor Day in 1894. Not everyone who has professed to advocate for laborers has proved to be a true friend. Karl Marx wrote a book on the subject, but he and his wife kept a maid for whom they provided room and board, but no pay. Marx fathered a pronounced woe on some rich folk in child by the woman, but she was not allowed to keep the child. Christians have a mandate from Scripture to protect the rights of those who are likely to be the victims of economic injustice. "The...ground of the poor would yield much food, but it is swept away by injustice." Proverbs 13:23. "Woe to him...who makes his neighbor serve him...and does not give him his wages." Jeremiah 22:13. Israel was seeking God daily as if they delighted to know His way. But God

told them He was not impressed as long as they oppressed all their workers. Isaiah 58:3c. Malachi records a passage about the coming Messiah in which Christ says, "I will be a swift witness...against those who oppress the hired worker in his wages." James these words, "...the wages of the laborers who mowed your fields, which you kept back by fraud, are crying out against you, and the cries of the harvesters have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts." May He hear our cries on their behalf also. It would be a shame if oppressed workers were crying out for justice, but Christ's church was silent.
