"Lord Jesus, I am weary in thy work, but not weary of it."

Hated by some but beloved by multitudes, George Whitefield drew massive crowds to his open air meetings in his native England and in his second home, America. On his way to preach in a Presbyterian Church in Newburyport, Massachusetts, he was unexpectedly stopped on Saturday September 29, 1770 in Exeter, New Hampshire. People had heard he was coming through and had already erected a platform for him to preach in one of the fields. It was to be his last field meeting. As he climbed the steps to the platform an elderly gentleman said, "Sir, you are more fit to go to bed than to preach." It was then that he uttered the words above, about his weariness. Though taking several minutes before he had strength to begin his message, he then preached for two

hours on the text, "Examine yourselves whether ye are in the faith." Exhausted he rode on to the home of Reverend Jonathan Parsons where he intended to go to bed early. As he ascended the stairs to his room, candle in hand, the front door swung open with a large crowd begging him to preach to them. He did so until the candle burned out. "At 7am that Sunday morning Whitefield entered the land for which he had been prepared by sovereign grace, the land to which he had pointed tens of thousands..."
