

## From Pearl Harbor to Calvary

President Roosevelt called the surprise bombing of Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941 a day to live in infamy. The Japanese Commander who led the 360 aircraft in the attack was Mitsuo Fuchida. Among the millions of Americans who received the news with shock and anger was Jacob De Shazer. He later joined the Jimmy Dolittle Squadron in a surprise attack on Tokyo. Returning from the raid his plane ran out of fuel and crashed in Japanese territory. He spent the next 3 years and 4 months in a P.O.W. camp. After 25 months the guards mysteriously allowed the prisoners to have Bibles. De Shazer read and read until he came to Christ for salvation. After the war he went to Japan as a missionary. One day he was distributing a printed copy of how he

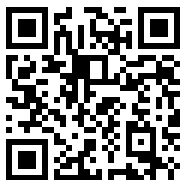
