Have you ever watched the TV program, FINDING YOUR ROOTS? The ancestry of well known people is researched to discover something about their distant relatives. Celebrities who are very different from one another are sometimes found to be related. A long time ago Paul told us we were all related. Yet, we do have histories that can make our lives very different from one another. The experiences of African-Americans in the USA in contrast to those of Caucasians is an example. The human designs that brought most African-Americans to these shores was exceedingly wicked. Yet the great black educator of the 19th century. Booker T. Washington, once wrote something like this. "Despite the evil of slavery, God used the awful institution, as He often does with various sins, for the good of our race. Through it we were exposed to the Gospel of Christ in a way we might never have been otherwise." Indeed, black Chris-

be thankful for this Joseph-like providence in their history. On the other hand, white Christians must face the fact that their material and political welfare has been elevated at the expense of others. Hopefully we would never justify slavery, but the reality is that we have enjoyed more advantages in this life than our black brothers because of it. We can be thankful that progress has been made by abolition, ending Jim Crow and segregation, but it is not a simple thing for African-Americans society as a whole to "catch up". It is like a sports event where all the rules are stacked against one team in the first half. When the rules are corrected in the second half it is unreasonable to expect the score to quickly even out. White Americans can never pay back black brothers and sisters for what their ancestors did to theirs. Nor should it be expected of them. However, God expects us to be vigilant to correct injustices that remain, and guard against deterioration in rights that have been secured. Without sympathy for our fellow citizens in these areas, our Gospel is likely to be rather lame. During Black History month, let us give special thought and prayer to our stewardship in this matter.
