How would vou finish the sentence? Many would say that the sentence does not need a finish. Nobody has the right to tell another how to live. Therefore the sentence stands alone, without an "unless." That is a correct answer for the most part. But all of us do add an "unless" in many areas of our living. We all recognize that there are certain areas of life where we are told how to live, and we willingly submit. We obey traffic regulations when driving. We pay taxes as ordered by the tax codes. We submit to our managers at work. There are very tangible and painful consequences to being self-willed in these areas. So we end the sentence something like, "Do not tell me how to live my life, unless you have the power to make my nonconformity painful enough to make me choose obedience." In addition to these mandatory areas there are many ways in which we choose to live our lives very much like a lot of other people are living theirs. Some of

the clothes we wear, the music we listen to, the recreation we choose, and even more important things like political opinions, and religious values.

This is the way I have chosen to complete the sentence. "Do not tell me how to live my life, unless you can overcome death!!" My reasoning is that death is the biggest problem known to the human race. Death has no respect for culture, geography, race, ages, or philosophy of life. It is the enemy of everyone. It ruthlessly spoils the lives of everyone. Eating right, getting exercise, having access to well trained care givers may result in a slightly longer life, but in the end death always wins. Jesus Christ is the only one who has the power to defeat death. He overcame his own death. He offers to overcome yours. The Bible says, "Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life; whoever does not obey the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God remains on him." John 3:36 - Pastor Charles Fortner
