The other half of the arithmetic of contentment is addition. We do not seek so much to rid ourselves of the burdens of our afflictions as to add to our souls a deeper and more truthful appraisal of our sinfulness and what it deserves. There is an inherent humility in Christian contentment and a basic arrogance in discontentment. Jesus likened our forgiveness to a debt of ten thousand talents (Matt. 18:24). Such a figure would have staggered the minds of his hearers, because a talent was seventy-five pounds of gold or silver. The sum of ten thousand talents would be equivalent in the modern world to billions of dollars in debt.

Most of us Christians do not feel the magnitude of that debt. When we first come to Christ, we only begin to see the sin problem. The Holy Spirit will spend the rest of our lives making us increasingly aware not only of the ten thousand talents we owed at conversion, but the ongoing depth of depravity in our present hearts and lifestyles.

Paradoxically, studying the horrors of hell can be a gateway to a resilient joy "in any and every circumstance." We walk through that gateway when we realize that we deserve to be in hell and instead are here on earth now. There is no condition on earth worse than hell: not suffering the ravages of disease in an ICU, not being incarcerated in a POW camp, not being in a sailboat in the midst of a hurricane, not even grieving at the funeral of a child. And as sinners, we all deserve to be in hell right now. But, thanks be to God, Christ drank hell for us on the cross, freeing us from the condemnation the law of God says we deserved (Rom. 3:9-10; 8:1).

These thoughts are humbling, and they give real spiritual teeth to the statement that some Christians make rather glibly when asked, "How are you doing?" In response they say, "Better than I deserve!" And yes, that is true, but how infinitely do we underestimate it.


